Big Lottery launches a Grant Called "Bright New Futures"



The Big Lottery Fund has launched Bright New Futures - a programme that aims to build resilience of young disabled people and young parents in Wales so that they have the life skills, knowledge and ability to manage key transitions in their lives.

Research and consultation has shown that both groups have a range of complex needs. They may experience gaps in service provision, duplication of some services and be unwilling to use services due to previous bad experiences. The Bright New Futures programme will make £12 million available for projects across Wales, working with young parents and/or young disabled people aged 14 – 25.

Grants of between £200,000 and £1 million are available to projects running for between three and five years. Third sector organisations with experience of working with at least one of the target groups will be eligible for funding.

Applicants must register their interest in the programme on the Big Lottery website by 13 October 2011.

Scope launches a new service

Scope Cymru will be opening a new transition service in early 2012. The service, currently being built in Leckwith, Cardiff, will be three five-bedroom bungalows for young people aged 18-25 with complex need care, support and learning needs. Each bungalow will have an en-suite wet room with tracking throughout. They will be offering full time placements of a maximum of three years as well as respite for regular or planned short breaks.

The service is located with easy access to further education colleges, leisure facilities, shops, cafes bars and public transport. Young people using the service will be able to choose from a variety of activities that are matched to their needs and will be supported in developing their skills for independence in preparation for adult life. Support with further transition and moving on will be available at the end of the three years program.

While located in Cardiff, it is designed to be an all-Wales service and we hope it to be only the first one, with the aim of opening a North Wales version in the future.

Transition Service in Powys

Powys Carers Service offers information advice and support to unpaid family Carers of all ages throughout Powys. Our service is free and confidential.

Young Adult Carers aged 16 to 25 experience particular difficulties in their transition from childhood to adulthood. Statutory services are often too fragmented to provide continuity through this period and many fall out of education, employment or training and are 'lost' to sources of support.

For the past 3 years PCS have been running a pilot with 2 specific Young Adult Carers Outreach Workers who provide one to one support & guidance tailored to each young person who suddenly find they now have Rights as Carers. Between the ages of 16 – 19 decisions are often made that can affect the whole of someone's life & often these Carers need specific support to help them grow & develop, explore further education & training opportunities as well as understand the Rights they now have, which includes whether they actually want to be a Carer or not.

The Outreach Workers work closely with school sixth forms, colleges, Careers Wales & other organisations, including statutory & voluntary, to sign post Young Carers to appropriate support. The work they do includes emotional support, well being workshops & social groups & events. Each individual's holistic support is planned with them with the aim of helping them becoming confident & working towards being independent.

**Professor Amanda Kirby from the
Discovery centre in Newport discusses
the transition from primary to secondary
school.**

Many children move smoothly through the transition from primary to secondary school and by the end of the second week know where they are and what they need to do.

A young person with specific learning difficulties such as dyspraxia, or dyslexia may take two terms rather than two weeks to gain these competencies.

In primary school there are fewer variables e.g. a limited number of teachers to relate to and less movement from class to class. The teachers will have learnt the child's particular learning style and appropriate ways to support. The child knows the environment and can navigate his way around the school confidently. Some young people arrive at secondary school seemingly coping up to this point.

The biggest change for children moving to secondary school is the environmental demands i.e. bigger school, more children, more teachers, more lessons, more changes from class to class.

There is greater expectation on the child to be independent but also greater demands on the individual than ever before. The Discovery Centre, University of Wales, Newport has developed two websites with specific help for this time.

The Centre runs regular holiday clubs to prepare children with a range of specific learning difficulties for times of transition.

CCN Cymru is supporting the development of key working through the transitional years (14-25) funded through and working in partnership with Welsh Government Support for Learners.

CCN Cymru has:

- Supported 5 pilot sites (7 local authorities) across Wales and has begun to disseminate the emerging good practice.
- Commenced supporting a further 9 local authority areas who have been funded through the European Social Fund Reaching the Heights: First Footholds grant programme to end March 2013

All the current sites have commenced developing transition key worker services with a mix of designated and non designated transition key workers.

The work of the 5 transition key worker pilots concluded in March 2011. All existing sites are now actively engaged at developing key worker support through transition.

CCN Cymru has also developed a Transition Key Worker training module. The autumn sees the main launch of the transition key worker training across Wales, having been successfully 'tried' in North Wales (participants from Conwy, Gwynedd, Denbighshire, Wrexham and Flintshire). Dates have been set to deliver (6x2 day courses) autumn programme (commencing with Heronsbridge School, Bridgend in September and culminating with Pembrokeshire in early December).

We have asked parents, support groups and other organisations on their opinions on transition in order to see if there any common tips, challenges to avoid and advice that we can offer you.

1. Early planning.

Parents suggested that by starting look at process early on you able to avoid many of the problems that can happen.

“It is never too early to start preparing for the transition because it always takes longer than you anticipate for decisions to be made and for action to be taken.”

2. Get everyone involved e.g. social, education and medical, to attend the annual review meetings.

“Take a social or health care professional with you who can explain to the school what their difficulties may be and how these could be overcome. A visit to the school with them may also help to identify potential hazards.”

3. Create routine and schedules as they allow you to minimise anxieties and concerns of child.

“Practice packing their bag, against a pretend timetable. This allows the child to prepare for every situation possible and therefore reduces anxiety.”

“Setting up routines and systems at home e.g. regular time for homework, suitable place to do homework, transparent homework box, routines and reminders about materials, equipments etc.

Sorting this the evening before with extra checks via a note and/or lists of what is need on each day on the back of the front door so it is checked as a child leaves “

4. Make sure the young person is at the centre of the process asking them concerns and making sure you plan for the future they want.

A parent suggested “Keep the young person central. Acquire their views, keep them informed. Would you like to have your life organised for you without getting a chance to say anything? Out of the mouths of babes... children are usually good at coming up with ideas.”

5. Visit the school/college/university before they start so that they can get idea of their surrounding.

“Meet the staff who will be teaching them even maybe take pictures so that can look over again when get home.”

“Build up gradually i.e. take them when students are in lessons until they can manage a visit at the busiest time. If your child needs to know rules let them have a copy to look over in the holidays and also give them time to ask one write down questions or concerns and make sure these are addressed as best you can”

6. Finding the Appropriate School

“My son was attending a Welsh Medium Primary School as well as a Special School, and I started asking what would happen at the end of Year 4 as he wouldn't be able to cope with the demands of a secondary school and I still wanted him to have Welsh medium input. We got to Easter of year 6, and we were still waiting to find out the answer. We then had a meeting in June to discuss the "options" for this September, which I already had asked to address 2 years previously, so I'd advise everyone to start the process ASAP!!! “

Mae Loteri Fawr yn lansio Grant o'r enw Dyfodol Newydd Disglair

Mae'r Gronfa Loteri Fawr wedi lansio Dyfodol Newydd Disglair – rhaglen sydd â'r nod o adeiladu gwytnwch pobl anabl ifanc a rhieni ifainc yng Nghymru fel bod ganddynt y sgiliau bywyd, y wybodaeth a'r gallu i reoli trosglwyddo allweddol yn eu bywydau.

Mae ymchwil ac ymgynghori wedi dangos bod gan y ddau grŵp ystod o anghenion cymhleth. Fe allant brofi bylchau yn y ddarpariaeth o wasanaethau, rhai gwasanaethau'n cael eu dyblygu, ac fe allant fod yn gyndyn o ddefnyddio gwasanaethau o ganlyniad i brofiadau drwg blaenorol. Fe fydd y rhaglen Dyfodol Newydd Disglair yn rhoi £12 miliwn ar gael ar gyfer prosiectau ledled Cymru, gan weithio gyda rhieni ifainc a/neu bobl anabl ifanc 14 - 25 mlwydd oed.

Mae grantiau o rhwng £200,000 ac £1 filiwn ar gael i brosiectau sy'n weithredol am rhwng tair a phum mlynedd. Fe fydd sefydliadau trydydd sector gyda phrofiad o weithio gydag o leiaf un o'r grwpiau targed yn gymwys am gyllid.

Mae'n rhaid i ymgeiswyr gofrestru'u diddordeb yn y rhaglen ar wefan y Loteri Fawr erbyn 13 Hydref 2011.

Fe fydd y gwasanaeth, sydd ar hyn o bryd yn cael ei adeiladu yn Lecwydd, Caerdydd, yn dri byngalo pum ystafell wely ar gyfer pobl ifanc 18-25 oed gyda gofal angen cymhleth, anghenion dysgu a chymorth. Fe fydd gan bob un byngalo ystafell wlyb *en-suite* gyda thracio drwyddo i gyd. Fe fyddant yn cynnig lleoliadau llawn amser gydag uchafswm o dair blynedd, yn ogystal â seibiant ar gyfer egwyliau byrion rheolaidd neu wedi'u cynllunio.

Mae'r gwasanaeth wedi'i leoli gyda mynediad rhwydd i golegau addysg bellach, cyfleusterau hamdden, siopau, barrau caffis a thrafnidiaeth gyhoeddus. Fe fydd pobl ifanc sy'n defnyddio'r gwasanaeth yn gallu dewis o amrywiaeth o weithgareddau sy'n cydweddu â'u hanghenion, ac fe fyddant yn cael eu cefnogi gyda datblygu'u sgiliau ar gyfer annibyniaeth wrth baratoi ar gyfer bywyd oedolyn. Fe fydd cefnogaeth gyda rhagor o bontio a symud ymlaen ar gael ar ddiwedd y rhaglen tair blynedd.

Er ei fod wedi'i leoli yng Nghaerdydd, mae o wedi'i gynllunio i fod yn wasanaeth Cymru gyfan, ac 'rydym yn gobeithio mai hwn yw ond yr un cyntaf, gyda'r nod o agor fersiwn yng Ngogledd Cymru yn y dyfodol.

Mae gwasanaethau statudol yn aml yn rhy dameidiog i ddarparu parhad drwy'r cyfnod hwn, ac mae llawer yn syrthio allan o addysg, cyflogaeth neu hyfforddiant ac maent wedi'u 'colli' rhag ffynonellau cefnogaeth.

Am y 3 blynedd diwethaf, mae Gwasanaeth Gofalwyr Powys wedi bod yn cynnal cynllun pilot gyda 2 Weithiwr Allgymorth penodol ar gyfer Gofalwyr sy'n Oedolion Ifainc, sy'n darparu cefnogaeth ac arweiniad un i un wedi'i deilwra ar gyfer pob person ifanc sydd yn sydyn yn canfod bod ganddynt yn awr Hawliau fel Gofalwyr. Rhwng yr oedrannau 16 - 19, mae penderfyniadau yn aml yn cael eu gwneud a all effeithio ar holl fywyd rhywun, ac yn aml y mae ar y Gofalwyr hyn angen cefnogaeth benodol i'w cynhorthwyo nhw i dyfu ac i ddatblygu, i edrych yn ofalus ar gyfleoedd addysg bellach a hyfforddiant, yn ogystal â deall yr Hawliau sydd ganddynt yn awr, sy'n cynnwys a oes arnynt mewn gwirionedd eisiau bod yn Ofalwr ai peidio.

Mae'r Gweithwyr Allgymorth yn gweithio'n agos gyda dosbarthiadau chwech mewn ysgolion, colegau, Gyrfa Cymru a sefydliadau eraill, yn cynnwys cyrff statudol a gwirfoddol, i ddangos y ffordd i Ofalwyr Ifainc at gefnogaeth briodol. Mae llawer o blant yn symud yn llyfn drwy'r trosglwyddo o'r ysgol gynradd i'r ysgol uwchradd, ac erbyn diwedd yr ail wythnos, maent yn gwybod lle maent a'r hyn y mae arnynt angen ei wneud.

Fe all person ifanc gydag anawsterau dysgu penodol, megis dyspracsia neu ddyslecsia, gymryd dau dymor yn hytrach na phytnefnos i ennill y cymwyseddau hyn.

Mewn ysgol gynradd, mae yna lai o newidynnau, e.e., nifer cyfyngedig o athrawon i gysylltu â nhw a llai o symudiad o ddsbarth i ddsbarth. Fe fydd yr athrawon wedi dysgu am arddull dysgu neilltuol y plentyn ac am ffyrdd priodol o gefnogi. Mae'r plentyn yn adnabod yr amgylchedd ac fe all fordyo'i ffordd o amgylch yr ysgol yn hyderus. Mae rhai pobl ifanc yn cyrraedd ysgol uwchradd i weld fel petaent yn ymdopi hyd at y pwynt hwn.

Y newid mwyaf i blant sy'n symud i ysgol uwchradd yw'r galwadau amgylcheddol, hynny yw, ysgol fwy, mwy o blant, mwy o athrawon, mwy o wersi, mwy o newidiadau o ddsbarth i ddsbarth.

Mae yna fwy o ddisgwyliad ar y plentyn i fod yn annibynnol ond hefyd mwy o alwadau ar yr unigolyn nag erioed o'r blaen. Mae Canolfan Discovery, Prifysgol Cymru, Casnewydd wedi datblygu dwy wefan gyda chymorth arbenigol ar gyfer yr amser hwn.

Mae Rhwydwaith Cydlynu Gofal Cymru (CCN Cymru) yn cefnogi'r gwaith o ddatblygu gweithio allweddol drwy'r blynyddoedd trosiannol (14-25), gan gael ei gyllido drwy ac yn gweithio mewn partneriaeth gyda Cymorth i Ddysgwyr gan Lywodraeth Cymru.

Mae CCN Cymru wedi:

- Cefnogi 5 o safleoedd peilot (7 awdurdod lleol) ledled Cymru ac y mae wedi dechrau lledaenu'r ymarfer da sy'n dod i'r amlwg.
- Dechrau cefnogi 9 yn rhagor o ardaloedd awdurdodau lleol sydd wedi'u hariannu drwy Gronfa Gymdeithasol Ewrop – Cyrraedd y Nod: rhaglen grantiau 'Troedle Cyntaf', sydd i orffen ym mis Mawrth 2013.

Mae'r holl safleoedd cyfredol wedi dechrau datblygu gwasanaethau gweithwyr allweddol trosglwyddo gyda chymysgedd o weithwyr allweddol trosglwyddo dynodedig a heb eu dynodi.

Fe wnaeth gwaith y 5 peilot gweithwyr allweddol trosglwyddo ddirwyn i ben ym mis Mawrth, 2011. Mae'r holl safleoedd presennol yn awr yn cymryd rhan yn weithredol gyda datblygu cefnogaeth gweithwyr allweddol drwy bontio.

Mae Rhwydwaith Cydlynu Gofal Cymru hefyd wedi datblygu modiwl hyfforddiant i Weithwyr Allweddol Trosglwyddo. Mae'r hydref yn gweld prif lansiad yr hyfforddiant i weithwyr allweddol trosglwyddo ledled Cymru, ar ôl cael ei 'dreialu'n' llwyddiannus yng Ngogledd Cymru (cyfranogwyr o Gonwy, Gwynedd, Sir Ddinbych, Wrecsam a Sir Y Fflint). ‘Rydym wedi gofyn i rieni, grwpiau cefnogi a sefydliadau eraill am eu barn ynglŷn â phontio er mwyn gweld a oes yna unrhyw gynghorion cyffredin, heriau i’w hosgoi a chyngor y gallwn ei gynnig ichi.

1. Cynllunio cynnar.

Fe awgrymodd rhieni mai drwy ddechrau edrych ar y broses yn gynnar, ‘rydych yn gallu osgoi llawer o’r problemau a all ddigwydd.

“Nid yw hi byth yn rhy gynnar dechrau paratoi ar gyfer y pontio oherwydd y mae hi yn wastad yn cymryd hwy nag ‘rydych yn ei ragweld i benderfyniadau gael eu gwneud ac i weithred gael ei chymryd.”

2. Dowch â phawb yn gysylltiedig, e.e., yn gymdeithasol, addysgol a meddygol, i fynychu’r cyfarfodydd adolygu blynyddol.

“Ewch â gweithiwr proffesiynol ym maes gofal cymdeithasol neu ofal iechyd gyda chi a all egluro wrth yr ysgol beth a all eu gwahaniaethau fod a sut y gellir goresgyn y rhain. Fe all ymweliad â’r ysgol gyda nhw hefyd fod o gymorth i nodi peryglon posib’.”

3. Crëwch drefn arferion ac amserlenni gan eu bod yn eich galluogi chi i leihau gorbryderon a phryderon y plentyn.

“Ymarferwch bacio’u bag, gyferbyn â thaflen amser smalio. Mae hyn yn caniatáu i’r plentyn baratoi ar gyfer pob sefyllfa bosibl, ac y mae felly’n lleihau gorbryder.”

“Sefydlu trefn arferion a systemau gartref, e.e., amser rheolaidd ar gyfer gwaith cartref, lle addas i wneud gwaith cartref, blwch gwaith cartref tryloyw, trefn arferion a ffyrdd o atgoffa o ddeunyddiau, cyfarpar, ac yn y blaen.”

“Cyfarfyddwch â’r staff fydd yn eu haddysgu nhw, hyd yn oed efallai tynnu lluniau fel y gallwch chi edrych arnynt eto pan gyrhaeddwch adref.”

“Datblygwch bethau’n raddol, hynny yw, ewch â nhw pan fydd myfyrwyr yn eu gwersi tan y gallant lwyddo i ymweld ar yr amser prysuraf. “Roedd fy mab yn mynychu Ysgol Gynradd Cyfrwng Cymraeg, yn ogystal ag Ysgol Arbennig, ac fe ddechreuais ofyn beth fyddai’n digwydd ar ddiwedd Blwyddyn 4, gan na fyddai’n gallu ymdopi â gofynion ysgol uwchradd, ac ‘roedd arnaf yn dal eisiau iddo gael mewnbwn drwy’r Gymraeg. Fe gyrhaeddom y Pasg ym Mlwyddyn 6, ac ‘roeddem yn dal i aros i ganfod yr ateb. 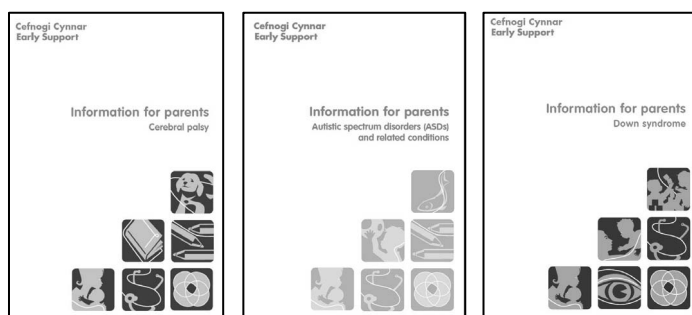

LOCAL PROJECTS: Key Worker pilot SOUTH WALES

Swansea, Neath-Port Talbot, Bridgend ABMU and the Voluntary Sector have started work on the Early Support Pilot.

All the Key workers have completed their training, attended focus groups, and are planning to have bi-monthly meeting to share good practice, ideas, and problem solve issues.

There is a good cross section of agencies, and experience in the groups. Consent for sharing information is in progress, as well as developing a structured approach to managing the pilots in each of the localities. This ensures that the systems are built in to local authority structures, with a reporting mechanism.

Feedback from parents in the pilot is beginning to trickle back and is also an exciting phase in the development.

Parent workshops in Cardiff

Autism Puzzles is a relatively new group set up for parents by parents of children with Autism in Cardiff.

They recently contacted us as they were disappointed to have missed out on the Parent workshops that were run earlier this year, and wanted to know how they could get the training. Goodbye! My name is Cameron, (although I think my Mammy forgets sometimes as she calls me lots of things like 'gorgeous, clever boy, sexy bum and my little angel!'). I don't mind though, I suppose she finds it difficult to remember everything at her age!

I am a very happy little boy and I love to run and jump and climb. I am always on the go! There are so many things in my life that make me smile and feel good in my belly. I love to swim, splashing and jumping and I've just learnt to swim on my own. I was very pleased when I learnt to do this and my Mam and Dad were really proud of me.



In September I started a new school. I am much happier there and my teachers are great. They really understand me and try to help me to understand the world that you all live in. You see, my world is different. That's why sometimes I get upset and confused. It's like everyone else is speaking a different language to me.

That's when I find life difficult. My Mammy and Daddy help me with this to try and keep me calm and explain things in ways I understand.

There are some things I really don't like doing, like going shopping, or going out for meals, but my Mammy makes me do this. She's even asked for a special trolley when we go shopping to make it easier for me, and she's good at taking my mind off things that bother me which helps.

LOCAL PROJECTS: Integrated Service for Children with Additional Needs (ISCAN)



Local reviews from services to children and young people with disabilities (CYPwD) Caerphilly County Borough Council Children and Young Peoples Partnership and the Health, Social Care and Wellbeing Committee indicated support for the need to develop an integrated multi-agency model of service delivery. A pilot project was planned and implemented named Integrated Service for Children with Additional Needs (ISCAN), starting with the age range 0-5 years. This commenced on 14th April 2010.

ISCAN aims to better manage fragmented service delivery for children under 5 year olds with disabilities and complex additional needs and their families, through developing an integrated one-stop service across Education, Health, Children's Services and the Third Sector.

By delivering an effective and trusted service for families and professionals, providing clear outcomes and clarity of the pathways, and better planning for transitions, it aims to reduce the stress levels for the child and family.

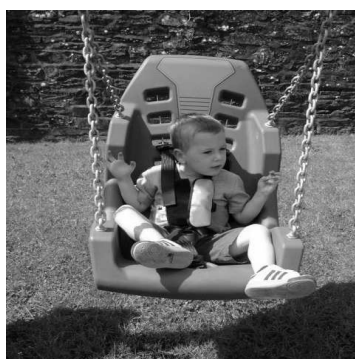
Early Support



The “front door” of ISCAN is at the Caerphilly Children’s Centre for receipt and management of referrals. It is built on a standard referral form to be used for all referrals for children where there are concerns about complex additional, medical, health, social and/or learning needs.

It also uses the Early Support Materials and has been embedded within the Caerphilly County Borough. The Lead Professional establishes Team around the Child and coordinates meetings to involve parents/carers.

The project has been undertaken by utilising existing resources across statutory and third sector agencies. The pilot phase of the service is fully operational and provides a Lead Professional and Team around the Child (TAC) approach through multi agency assessment and care planning. Currently, 61 children and families receive support from ISCAN. The pilot has been externally evaluated with positive outcomes for children and their families and discussions are taking place to explore the possibility of extending the age range.

“Jill at Contact a Family encouraged me to sign up for the Early Support parent workshop and my husband joined me for the last session. Through that workshop, apart from the great material and lovely people I met, I was introduced to information and benefits we had no idea were available.

The help and support of the other participants was invaluable, as their experience helped to put our problems in perspective and gave us ideas for improvements. All of this has meant we enjoy life more and celebrate our daughter’s many strengths rather than being preoccupied with her condition.

After the parent workshop I got the training bug and went on to complete the PESCAF (Providing Early Support for children with additional needs and their families) level 4 courses (at the end even volunteering to become a trainer!).

The great thing about the course was working with different professionals and seeing things from their position as well as getting them to understand a parent’s viewpoint.

As a result, I have been asked to help with other parent courses and meetings to provide a parents perspective. I hope that through this initiative all services will be family friendly and that everyone’s experience will be as positive as ours has generally been.

I also intend to continue with Early Support and will be signing up for another course soon!”

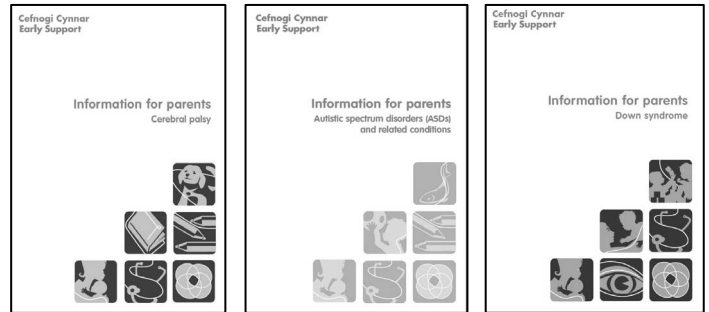
